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# SERVING GOD IN THE BODY OF CHRIST

**1 Peter 4:10**

*"Each one should use whatever gift he has received to serve others, faithfully administering God's grace in its various forms."*

Not all of us are called to go out to be missionaries in the mission fields. God calls us to serve Him in various ways and we must be obedient to His call. We have often heard some people say: "Oh, I am too old to serve Him". That is not true and if God can use an inexperienced young shepherd boy to kill Goliath He will surely use us if we are willing. The keyword here is 'If you are willing'.

Some like the Foot Soldiers and missionaries are called out into the fields to spread the word and minister, while there are those that are called to support those in the mission fields. The support you give especially in supporting financially, helps ease their burdens. It helps with taking care of their needs and the needs of their ministry. There are also those who are called to intercede and pray for these soldiers and all other missionaries. Whichever the calling, God will surely bless those who answer His call and tend to His sheep.

Every Christian organization needs Intercessors praying for them and here in Asian Outreach we have been blessed to have a group of dedicated Prayer Warriors praying for us. They meet once a month and we send them our prayer requests and the group prays and intercedes for the ministry. Intercession praying means that these prayer warriors pray fervently for the needs of others and for God to make His will known.

Intercession is warfare - the key to God's battle plan for our lives. But the battleground is not of this earth. The Bible says in **Ephesians 6:12** *"We are not fighting against humans. We are fighting against forces and authorities and against rulers of darkness and spiritual powers in the heavens above"*. Intercessory prayer takes place in this spiritual world where the battles for our own lives, our families, our friends and our nation and our ministry are won or lost. The Holy Spirit has set within us a burden for the establishment of prayer as in **Isaiah 56:7** *"These I will bring to my holy mountain and give them joy in my house of prayer. Their burnt offerings and sacrifices will be accepted on my altar; for my house will be called a house of prayer for all nations."*

We are truly grateful for these men and women who have a burden to pray for us and even though our Foot Soldiers and missionaries have not met them or know them personally, they are comforted that a group of people are committed to pray for them regularly. It's not only once a month that they pray but whenever we have an urgent prayer request it is sent out immediately and they respond as soon as they receive it. We have seen God move as a result of their prayers.

We personally believe that all effective intercession begins in the heart of God and prayer which agrees with the will of God is prayer that gets results. Effective intercession is an act of faith, and intercession is an art—the art of lining up one's heart with God's

We would like to honour these group of intercessors who have been so faithful in praying for us.

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# I HAVE CALLED YOU BY NAME, YOU ARE MINE

**M**y name is Veronica Cabangangan from the Samar, District of Leyte in Tacloban, in the Philippines. My husband, Dinnes and I have 3 children, 2 girls and a boy. My husband and I have been working with Ps Nena Ibanez since 1998 in the Church of Santa Fe Christian Fellowship, helping her in the children's ministry, youth ministry, and other ministries. However, for the past 5 years we have been pastoring a sister church of Santa Fe Christian Fellowship.

I praise the Lord for giving me this opportunity to share my testimony.

My family are Catholic but at the age of 5, I began to attend an AOG church with my older sister who was the first born again Christian in our family. Even at such an early age I loved the Lord and enjoyed going to church with my sister and I found such a big difference from the Catholic church. I received water baptism at the age of 12 and immediately I began to teach in the Sunday school in my church. Our mother was very against us leaving the Catholic church and was very angry that my sister and I had gone to a different denomination even though she herself hardly went to church. She daily persecuted us but that did not stop us from going to church and being involved in teaching children in our *barangay*.

My father on the other hand was very supportive, unlike my mother who was cruel and abusive. He loved us and was always there for us, often protecting us against our mother's cruelty. He would encourage us to pray and read the Bible. One day my adopted brother had a quarrel with my father and stabbed him to death right in front of my eyes. I stood in horror as I watched my father fall to the ground, blood pouring out from his stomach. I ran to him and held him in my arms crying out to God not to let my father die but my father died in my arms. I screamed for help but no one came to help as my neighbours were afraid of my adopted brother who was often violent and had a bad temper. Everybody was afraid so they ran away from us.

I started to hate God and people and decided to turn my back and never again to call His name. My sister also was very discouraged as she too went through many trials and difficulties after our dad died. We both backslided and though I told myself I was angry with God for not helping my dad and hardened my heart against Him I could not turn away from Him all together. I would find myself slowly calling His name or talking to Him like I used to do before. The more I turned away from Him the more He filled my thoughts.

My mother became worse, she would invite her drinking partners to our house and when they were drunk it was a scary time for us. One time I almost became a victim of rape. I was so afraid. My sister tried to talk to our mum and pleaded with her not to invite those men to our house as it was not safe for her and me but my mom only laughed at us and then she got so angry with us and beat us. Things only got worse after that until my sister and I felt that for our own safety we had to run away from home to live with my

married sister. We were filled with such hatred for our mother.

Although my sister and her husband were not well off, they took us in and we lived peacefully with them. A few years later I developed measles and fell really ill. My hair started falling out and I began to lose so much weight, that I was just skin and bones. As I looked into the mirror one evening and saw this pale ragged face looking back at me I started to weep and I cried out to the Lord saying, "Why don't you

just kill me? Take my life; I do not want to live anymore." I asked the Lord to forgive me for my anger towards him and also my mother. As my tears flowed before the Lord, I received healing and could feel my body healing. In the days that followed, I received total healing - mentally, emotionally, physically and spiritually.

I went to see my mother and forgave her for what she had done to us. My mother cried and asked my forgiveness too and I went back to live with her. She was a changed woman and I shared the Word with her and we would pray together. Praise God after a few years she also became born again. My sister and I both went to Bible School and we are now serving God full time. Another sister of ours also became a full-time pastor and most of the members of our family are born again.

Thank God for His amazing grace. The Lord blessed me with a family, a loving husband and supportive kids in the ministry. We are now serving God together with one heart, mind and one spirit.

All glory to God! In Him all things are possible!

## TO KEEP PRESSING ON

**A**ttacks against Christian have increased, and Hindu radicals have attacked Christians with no consequences. As a result, Christians have been targeted by Hindu nationalist extremists more and more each year. To the nationalists Indian is to be Hindu, so any other faith—including Christianity—is considered non-Indian. In some regions the persecution is extreme and severe especially targeting the converts from Hinduism who bear the brunt of the Christian persecution in India and are constantly under pressure by the state, their community and their families to return to Hinduism.

Still our Foot Soldiers press on for the Kingdom of God and have Reached, Touch and Transform lives through the Gospel. There is no slowing down but there is an urgency for the work of the Kingdom to continue. So many people have not heard the Gospel of Jesus Christ yet.

On 18 April, 2019, 27 people were baptised in Sullurpetta Town in India and Ps Joshua and his wife led these 27 people into the Kingdom. There were 3 more that were to take baptism with the rest but at the last minute they withdrew out of fear and harassment by the family. The 27 people stepped out boldly to take the next step in their journey of faith. They accepted Jesus as their Lord and Saviour and were ready for whatever God had in store for them, a new beginning with Him.

Ps Joshua and his wife paid a heavy price for these 27 souls. Once the villagers came to find out that some of them were attending church, they harassed Ps Joshua and his wife and beat him up. Whenever Ps Joshua's wife would walk in the village people would come out and spit at her and verbally abuse her. This happened on a daily basis and even their Hindu friends turned against them. When the Hindu extremist saw that this was not stopping Ps Joshua, they reported him to the police and had him arrested. They accused him of paying people to turn to Christianity. This case is still going on and we solicit your prayers for Ps Joshua. If found guilty he could go to jail.

Ps Joshua persevered and never gave up. He saw how people were hungry for the Lord and Ps Joshua knew he could not stop even when faced with danger. Kunnaiya was an alcoholic and a drug addict and eventually the drug took a toll on him and he roamed the streets of the village, unkempt and insane. His wife Rama approached Ps Joshua to help her husband and she started coming to church and prayed with Ps Joshua for her husband's healing and deliverance. 3 months later her husband returned to their home weary and exhausted and she ministered to him. Together they started attending church and Kunnaiya received complete healing. They were part of the 27 people who were baptised.

Ramesh a staunch Hindu met an accident and broke his spine. He went from doctor to doctor but none could help him and he was condemned to life as a paraplegic. He was the sole bread winner and his family were suffering now as there was no income coming

in. In desperation his wife heard neighbours telling her of this Christian God who could help her husband and she and her family carried Ramesh on a stretcher to church one day. They had to travel 60km to reach the church and Ramesh had to endure a rough and agonizing ride. Ps Joshua shared the Gospel with them and his wife was convinced Jesus could help them so they prayed and, in a few weeks, God healed Ramesh completely. He has even gone back to work. Every Sunday the whole family faithfully make the 60km trip to church without fail. They are part of the 27 people who were baptised.

Rammanamma was known as a temple philanthropist and was a strong Hindu worshipper. She hated the Christians and she would stand outside the church and curse and swear at the Christians going in. During Sunday service she would stand outside and hurl verbal abuse at the church in a loud voice. One day after a fight with her daughter-in-law and son, she was chased out of the house. She lived on the streets with no food and no place to go. Ps Joshua met her and prayed with her and he would share his own food with her, whatever little he had. He shared the love of Jesus with her and in time she repented and accepted Jesus. Then came the miracle. Her son and daughter-in-law took her back home and now the whole family has been baptised.

Ps Joshua is faithfully carrying out this task that God commanded him to do in the Great Commission. This command is for all of us and like Ps Joshua nothing must deter us from fulfilling what God has asked us to do. It is not only in the mission fields that we can do our part in the Great Commission but we can support those in the fields with our prayers and financial support as you, our faithful partner has been doing. We are truly grateful for your partnership and on behalf of the Foot Soldiers, the children in the homes and in the slum centres we thank you for joining us in this task that God commanded us to do.

Every year after the students graduate from Bible School, they go on a mission trip to the Chin state to evangelize and organize outreach programmes. This year after much prayer and discussion with my wife, we decided to take my whole family with us. My children, Grace Lydia 12 years old, Victoria Rebeka 9 years old, Juely Hannah 7 years old and the youngest, John Samuel 4 years old. They were so excited to be joining us on this trip. Every year they watch me leave for this long trip and we would be away for a month or so. So this time when they were told they would be going they could hardly contain themselves.

We took a bus from Yangon to the town of Matupi which is a 2 day' trip, breaking our journey for a day so as not to tire the children but they were so excited to keep moving on. The next day we continued our journey to Caki village. We travelled half-way by an old bus and then the rest of the way on motorbikes. We travelled for what seemed like hours on the bikes along the bumpy mountain terrain and finally reached Caki village at 6 pm in the evening. My body was sore by the end of the ride but my children were more excited than ever and did not even look tired.

When we reached the village, the villagers had already set up the tents and were eagerly awaiting us. The tents were for our evangelistic meetings and that very night, though we were sore and tired we could not disappoint the village and did not want to either, so we held our first meeting. The response was overwhelming and we could see how hungry the people were for the Word. We held meetings every night and during the day we would go house to house for evangelization. On the last night 40 people gave their lives to Jesus Christ. Many were touched by the power of the Holy Spirit and there was a revival in the village.

We left that village after 4 days and went back to Matupi and again the young people from the village sent us by motorbike to where the old bus picked us up for the rest of the journey. The

road was extremely dusty and soon we were covered with dust, grime. My son laughed to see me saying I looked like a white man with light coloured hair. My children never complained about anything and just took everything in their stride. Half way on our journey the bus suddenly blew a tyre and that it took some time to repair. It was getting dark and all around us was the jungle and I could see the worrying look on my wife's face because of the children. We prayed together and asked the Lord to keep us safe and God is faithful to those who trust in Him. Suddenly, we saw a big truck come up the road and the driver took us to the next town to wait for the bus so my children could get some food.

We waited for some time at that village for the bus to come and pick us up. Unfortunately, when we got to the next village of Ngala the tyre blew again and it took us another 4 hours to be on our way. By the time we got to Matupi it was midnight and the kids were exhausted. Sometimes God teaches us to be patient with others and though we had some setbacks we praise and thank God for His mercy and looking out for us. We were so hungry especially my children but thank God my wife's sister prepared dinner for us and they still waited for us and we had a very good dinner.

The next day the people from Sun Tui Village came to take us to their village for the crusade. Road conditions here were very bad and we were advised not to take the children. So to the disappointment of my children they had to stay back in their aunt's house. They enjoyed themselves though playing with their cousins and the other children in the village.

Three of us in the team went by motorbikes but half-way, for some reason, our riders suddenly stopped and told us they could not go further and left us along the jungle path. We were bewildered as to why they did this. There was no signal and no way to contact anyone so we sat by the path for 3 hours, praying and seeking

God. We could not walk up the mountain because we had our luggage with us. After 3 hours the organizers who had invited us came looking for us as they were wondering why we had not reached. Two motorbikes came to look for us but there was 3 of us, so I decide to let my wife and the Bible student ride on the bikes with our luggage while I walk up. When we got to the first village on our way to Sui Tui village, we stopped and because the condition of roads are bad, my feet hurt and walking was so painful. My wife said riding the bike was equally bad.

It was getting dark so we had to break journey in this village. Thank God the villagers welcomed us and gave us dinner. This village is predominantly Buddhist and they were curious about us. I told them we were Christian pastors and expected them to be hostile but praise God they were not. In the early morning we continue to walk to our destination and the organizers came to pick us up half way by motorbike and we arrived there at 8 am. They told us that they waited for us till midnight and many were disappointed so we immediately started our teaching and preaching in that village.

Sun Tui Village is in a very remote area up the mountains and in the old days the people here were fierce and revengeful. They were ancestor worshippers before converting to Christianity. We taught and preached day and night and 20 people dedicated their lives to Jesus and many were delivered. The power of the Holy Spirit really touched many of them. I saw many of them were under inter-generational curses that needed to be broken. Let us continue to pray for the villagers of Sun Tui that God may deliver them from these curses. It was sad to hear that many had not heard of the Name of Jesus.

Dear brothers and sisters we enjoy the presence of God but there are many who do not know Him yet. When we left the village the whole village came out to say goodbye, begging us to return again and not to forget them. We see many people are hungry for the

Gospel of Jesus Christ and there are a lot of villages around that area called the Daai region, a very undeveloped and unreached area that is still not penetrated with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Join us to pray that we will be able to raise up more foot soldiers, willing to serve the Lord and bring the Gospel to these remote regions. This year we are sending two of our graduates, Soe Moe Naing and Yo Han to plant churches in the Delta area. Please pray for them that God may use them to Reach, Touch and Transform lives through the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Praise God we got back safely to our children and returned to Yangon. I asked my children if they wanted to go next year again and in one union the shout "Yes, please papa." It was a good exposure for them specially to meet the villagers and learn about their culture and traditions. Though we are all Burmese there are many different tribes, each with its own culture and tradition. Children also can evangelize to other children.

**Prayer Points**

1. Pray for protection for Myanmar's Christians, especially in the Karen and Kachin States, where they are often targeted by troops and Buddhist nationalists.
2. Pray for the continued spread of the Gospel across this nation, for freedom to worship for all people, and for many to have life changing encounters with Jesus Christ.
3. Pray for the Holy Spirit to move over Myanmar, to turn many hearts to the truth of the Gospel and bring transformation to families and communities in this land.

# TEACHING TRIP TO ULAAN BAATAR, MONGOLIA

I was privileged to be introduced by Asian Outreach (M) to Genesis-AO, which is a registered Christian NGO affiliated with many local churches and Christian NGO overseas. My objective for this trip is to engage in teaching in a summer pastoral camp from the 5-10 June, organized by Genesis-AO with the intention of building up the Body of Christ in Mongolia. The local churches participated in the camp and under the cooperation with Genesis-AO are:

There was such a hunger and thirst for the Word that I was taken by surprise during the two days camp. They loved the Word being expounded theologically and at the same time desire to see the practical aspect in their daily living. They just couldn't have enough of the illustrations, examples and demonstration of the Word during the sessions. In fact, from their own admission, they have not heard the Word being taught in such a comprehensive manner where they can see the big picture and the heart of God with regard to the work on the Cross, the transformation of lives and the Kingdom of God for now and the future.

Mongolia is a nation that is ripe for the harvest. Though much of her ancestral land has been annexed by Russia, China and Kazakhstan, it is still a vast land to be reckoned with a tiny population of 3.5 million. The local churches are on the verge of an evangelism explosion especially in the marketplace where many city people has been drawn to because of its caring and loving nature. It is in the right season where God is doing a new thing for this nation where more than half its people is living in the capital of Ulaan Baatar and for most part of the year, 9 out of 12 months to be exact, are in freezing sub-zero temperature.

Genesis-AO is doing a tremendous NGO work in reaching out through education in both government and private schools in subjects like moral and character building using biblical values. Its program is sanctioned by the government and is well received by the public. Its focus is mainly on school going children and youths from ages 12 to 18. Its impact is far reaching into the future in building the next generation ready for the Gospel harvest. Its current operation is headed by Ps Badmaa Tsogoo and a dozen of other staffs who are full time teachers. Ps Badmaa also pastored a family church in the heart of the city besides his NGO work. From hindsight, Genesis-AO is already moving into the family and education institutions of the cultural mandate which I have been trying to teach as part of the subject of the Kingdom of God. In summary, God's plan for Mongolia is about to unfold in a big way and all glory belong to Him!
